<u>DEVELOPMENT & PEACE</u> - (Who Owes Whom?) Countries in the global south face crushing debt payments that keep them from investing in their people. At the same time, countries in the global north owe them an ecological debt for exploiting their resources and destroying their environments. This destruction drives climate change, which most adversely affects society in the Global South that are least responsible for it. Pope Francis calls our attention to this injustice in *Laudatory Si*. We believe that recognizing ecological debt is vital step toward addressing the global debt crisis, and creating a sustainable, just future for all.

NEW STATISTICS REVEAL GROWING CATHOLIC POPULATION - The global Catholic population increased by 1.15% between 2022 and 2023, rising from approximately 1.39 billion to 1.406 billion. Africa includes 20% of the Catholics of the entire planet and is characterized by a highly dynamic spread of the Catholic Church. With a growth of 0.9% over the biennium, the Americas consolidate their position as the continents to which 47.8% of the world's Catholics belong. Of these, 27.4% reside in South America (where Brazil, with 182 million, represents 13% of the world total and continues to be the country with the highest concentration of Catholics), 6.6% in North America, and the remaining 13.8% in Central America. The Asian continent records a growth of Catholics of 0.6% over the biennium, and its weight in 2023 is around 11% of the global Catholic population. In 2023, 76.7% of Southeast Asian Catholics are concentrated in the Philippines, with 93 million, and in India, with 23 million.



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

LENT - "The spiritual meaning of Lent is a profound 40-day journey of introspection, renewal, and spiritual growth, culminating in the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday. Rooted in early Christian practices, Lent is a time for spiritual fasting and detox, cultivating mindful eating habits and a greater appreciation for life's simplicity. Through prayer, reflection, and repentance, individuals can gain a deeper understanding of themselves and their relationship with a higher power. By embracing solitude, seeking forgiveness, and letting go of negative patterns, one can connect with Jesus' journey, drawing closer to God and their true self, and discovering a profound sense of purpose and transformation that extends far beyond the Lenten season. As you navigate this transformative period, the possibilities for spiritual growth, renewal, and connection are endless."

THE SIGN OF THE CROSS - The sign of the cross began to be used by Christians as early as the second century AD. Here are a few testimonies of the early Church Fathers on the Sign of the Cross: Tertullian (160 AD) "At every going in and out, when we put on our clothes and shoes, when we bathe, when we sit at table, when we light the lamps, on couch, on seat, in all the ordinary actions of daily life, we trace upon the forehead the sign of the cross." Athanasius (296 AD)- "But we by the mention of Christ crucified put all demons to flight, whom you fear as if they were gods. Where the sign of the Cross is, magic is weak and witchcraft has no strength." Jerome (347 AD)- "In every act we do, in every step we take, let our hand trace the Lord's cross." Ephraim (306 AD)- "Whether in eating or in drinking, whether in sleeping or in waking, neglect not this sign of the cross; for there is no guardian like it. And teach this to thy children, that heedfully they be conformed to it." Cyril (315 AD) "Let us not then be ashamed to confess the Crucified. Be the Cross our seal made with boldness by our fingers on our brow, and on everything; over the bread we eat, and the cups we drink; in our comings in, and goings out; before our sleep, when we lie down and when we rise up; when we are in the way, and when we are still."

CAPTURING THE LIFE OF OUR PARISH - Our parish is a place of faith, community, and service, and we want to celebrate that vibrancy. The bishop encourages all parishes in the diocese to ensure their websites are welcoming and engaging, as they serve as an important means for people to connect and find the information they need.
