





FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

ADVENT - At its essence, Advent embodies the timeless message of hope, peace, joy, and love, encapsulating the fundamental principles



of the Christian faith. It serves as a period of spiritual preparation, inviting believers to reflect on the profound mystery of the Incarnation and the transformative impact of Christ's birth on humanity. Advent underscores the anticipation of the promised Messiah and the fulfillment of God's covenant with humanity. It serves as a bridge between the Old Testament prophecies foretelling the coming of the Savior and the New Testament fulfillment of these prophecies in the birth of Jesus Christ. This sacred season invites believers to immerse themselves in the rich tapestry of biblical narratives, fostering a deeper understanding of the redemptive promise fulfilled through the birth of Jesus.

SUNDAY ENVELOPES - If you are using Envelopes for Sunday & Special offerings, it is now ready at the entrance. Ask Darrell or Ian Manley to assist you find your numbered envelope. FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION - The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is usually celebrated by the Catholic Church on December 8. But for this year 2024 it will be transferred to December 9 because December 8 falls on Sunday which coincides with the celebration of the second Sunday of Advent. In other countries like U.S. and Philippines, the feast of the Immaculate Conception is a day of obligation. The dogma of the Immaculate Conception is the belief that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was free of original sin from the very moment of her conception. In 1854, Pope Pius IX proclaimed the dogma through the papal bull "Ineffabilis Deus"(Ineffable God).

THE YEAR OF THE JUBILEE 2025. In the Catholic Church, the concept of Jubilee or 'Holy Year' is used to declare special years for forgiveness and reconciliation. "Jubilee" is the name given to a particular year, a time to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of Creation. Pope Francis has announced that 2025 will be a Jubilee Year, something which happens every 25 years. The theme for Jubilee 2025 is "Pilgrims of Hope," and it will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, and the climate crisis. The Jubilee begins on December 24, 2024, with the official Opening of the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica, and runs to January 6, 2026, the Feast Day of Epiphany, with the Closing of the Holy Door.

POPE FRANCIS (Finding Peace through Prayer & Fasting) - "People today do not know how to find peace. As Christians, we must never tire of imploring peace from God. That is why I have urged everyone to observe a day of prayer and fasting. Prayer and fasting are the weapons of love that change history, the weapons that defeat our one true enemy: the spirit of evil that foments war, because it is "murderous from the beginning", "a liar and the father of
