

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

ADVENT - (Third Advent Gaudete Sunday) -The third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is the Latin word for rejoice. On Gaudete Sunday of Advent we are invited to reflect on the joy we have access to because of our faith in Jesus. One of the defin-



ing characteristics of Christ-followers is their joyful demeanor. Let's not allow the struggles of this year steal from the great joy we have because of Jesus. Philippians 4:4-5 says, "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near." The lighting of Rose Candle in advent wreath today symbolizes that joy in our heart.

ADVENT PENITENTIAL SERVICE - We have invited some priests to help hear your confession

on Saturday December 21 at 9am. Every confession is a fresh beginning, a new start. As the prophet Isaiah puts it, "Though your sins be like scarlet, they may become white as snow." During Advent we do not just live in anticipation of Christmas; we are also called to rekindle the anticipation of the glorious return of Christ, when he will return at the end of time, preparing ourselves, with consistent and courageous choices, for the final @ encounter with him. We remember Christmas, we await the glorious re-

turn of Christ, and also our personal encounter: the day in which the Lord will call. **SUNDAY ENVELOPES** - If you are using Envelopes for Sunday & Special offerings, it is now

Ask Darrell or Ian Manley to assist you find your numbered envelope. **THE YEAR OF THE JUBILEE 2025.** In the Catholic Church, the concept of Jubilee or 'Holy Year' is used to declare special years for forgiveness and reconciliation. "Jubilee" is the name given to a particular year, a time to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of Creation. Pope Francis has announced that 2025 will be a Jubilee Year, something which happens every 25 years. The theme for Jubilee 2025 is "Pilgrims of Hope," and it will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, and the climate crisis. The Jubilee begins on December 24, 2024, with the official Opening of the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica, and runs to January 6, 2026, the Feast Day of

CANADA'S NEW CARDINAL (Cardinal Frank Leo) - Twenty-one men are being created

Cardinal Saturday 7th December held in St Peter's Basilica. Among them is Archbishop Frank Leo, of Toronto, Canada – who, at 53 years old, will become one of the youngest members of the College of Cardinals. Asked about some of the biggest challenges facing the Church today, Cardinal Leo listed secularism, political polarization & throwaway culture. The Church's response to the problems, he said, must "start from the human heart", and our relationship with God: we need a "spiritual awakening", one that inspires us to "bring the newness of life, of God, into the world today."
