FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION/CANDLEMAS - The Presentation of Jesus in the temple is celebrated in the Church's calendar on February 2nd—also known as "Candlemas," an allusion to Simeon's words about the boy Jesus being "a light for revelation to the Gentiles" (Lk 2:32). On Candlemas, Christians take their candles to their local church, where they are blessed and then used for the rest of the year; for Christians, these blessed candles serve as a symbol of Jesus Christ,



who is referred to as the Light of the World. Christ's light continues to shine today through his people. We are the Light of the world, as Jesus told us, but the light that is in us does not come from ourselves or our deeds, no matter how holy and righteous we may think ourselves to be. The luster of our lives is *Christ* shining His way, His truth, and His life through us. Like the moon reflects the light of the sun back to a dark world, we too reflect the light of Christ to a world of people in darkness.

THE INDEFECTIBILITY OF THE CHURCH - The Church survived three hundred years of incredible persecution under pagan Rome. Of the 33 Popes that ruled before the Edict of Milan, 30 died as martyrs. That mighty Empire, with its colossal strength, before whose standard the nations quailed, could not kill the infant Church or stop its progress. In a short time the Popes were ruling where the imperial Caesars had issued edicts against the Christian Church. The Roman Empire waged ten fierce persecutions against the Church, but could not destroy it. In the year 313 the Emperor Constantine was converted and granted the Church freedom by the Edict of Milan. (to be continued)
