<u>GAZA DEATH TOLL TOPS 46,000</u>- According to the Ministry of Health, at least 46,006 people have been killed and 109,378 wounded since the war began 15 months ago. UN humanitarians claim that Israel has ordered more civilians to relocate in North Gaza because of impending attacks in retaliation for rocket attacks into Israel. Most civilians in the enclave, already displaced multiple times, are often forced to up-sticks amid concentrated bombardment. Elsewhere, Hamas has confirmed that indirect negotiations with Israel have resumed in Qatar, with the aim of achieving a total ceasefire in the Gaza strip.

**POPE FRANCIS** - The pope has called for a "negotiation" to end the war in Ukraine in a Christmas Day message where he appealed for weapons to be laid down in global conflicts and reconciliation between enemies. "May the sound of arms be silenced in wartorn Ukraine!". "May there be the boldness needed to open the door to negotiation and to gestures of dialogue and encounter, in order to achieve a just and lasting peace." "I think of the Christian communities in Israel and Palestine, particularly to the dear community in Gaza". "May there be a ceasefire, may the hostages be released and aid be given to the people worn out by hunger and by war."

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

FEAST OF BAPTISM OF THE LORD - In the liturgical calendar, the Feast of the Baptism of the

Lord signifies the end of the Christmas season. The Baptism of the Lord is notable because it marks the beginning of Jesus' ministry and confirms his identity as the Son of God. Christ's baptism remarkably shows all three Persons of the Trinity at the same time: the Son being baptized, the Holy Spirit descending, and the Father speaking from the heavens. In this event, the Father and the Holy Spirit confirm the deity of Christ, and Jesus submits to his Father's will. When Jesus comes to John, John hesitates to baptize him.



Why does Jesus insistent to get baptized? John's is a baptism of repentance, and Jesus has nothing for which he needs to repent. But by choosing to be baptized, Jesus fulfills all righteousness – preparing himself to be a perfect sacrifice for us. Drawing profound parallels between Jesus' baptism and our own, we can see that, just as Jesus is revealed as the beloved Son so, too, we receive a new identity in baptism as adopted children of the Father. At the moment of our spiritual rebirth in the font, the Father beholds us with delight, exclaiming, "This is my beloved son, this is my beloved daughter with whom I am well pleased."

CHRISTMAS SEASON - According to the norms issued by the Church, "The liturgical season of Christmas begins with the vigil Masses on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord." Hence, today's weekend of the feast of the Baptism of the Lord does mark the definitive end of the Christmas liturgical cycle.

THE INDEFECTIBILITY OF THE CHURCH - By the indefectibility of the Catholic Church is meant that the Church, as Jesus Christ founded it, will last until the end of time. Archangel Gabriel told Mary, that Christ "shall be king over the house of Jacob forever; and of His kingdom there shall be no end" (Luke 1: 32). Christ meant His Church to endure to the end of the world. It is to be indestructible and unchanging, - to possess indefectibility. Christ, God Himself, could scarcely have come, and with such incredible pain and labor have founded a Church which would die with the Apostles. He came to save all men. Those to live in future ages needed salvation as much as the people of Apostolic times. After telling His Apostles to teach all nations, Christ said: "Behold, I am with you until the end of time" (Mat 28:20). As the Apostles were not to live to the end of the world, Christ must have been addressing them as representatives of a perpetual Church.
