<u>POPE FRANCIS AWARD</u> - President Joe Biden on Saturday honored Pope Francis with the Presidential Medal of Freedom with distinction, the highest civilian award given by the president, saying the pontiff was "a light of faith, hope, and



love that shines brightly across the world." The citation for the pope says "his mission of serving the poor has never ceased. A loving pastor, he joyfully answers children's questions about God. A challenging teacher, he commands us to fight for peace and protect the planet. A welcoming leader, he reaches out to different faiths."


SEVERE CHRISTIAN PERSECUTION - The Open Doors organization has published the World Watch List, highlighting that North Korea is the toughest country for Christians to reside in. Last year, the highest number of Christian murders occurred in Nigeria. The report covers 50 countries where persecution is most severe. According to Open Doors, more than 380 million Christians in 78 countries experience persecution and discrimination. In the 50 countries on the list, persecution reaches a "very high or extreme level," affecting approximately 310 million Christians. The top ten countries with the worst situations include North Korea, Somalia, Yemen, Libya, Sudan, Eritrea, Nigeria, Pakistan, Iran, and Afghanistan. The report also notes over 14,000 attacks on churches and places of worship worldwide.

POPE FRANCIS ON CHRISTIAN PERSECUTION - On the occasion of the feast of St. Stephen (the first Christian martyr ), Pope Francis renewed his call for peace and brought attention to the persecution that Christians are facing around the world. "Today , 2,000 years later, unfortunately we see that the persecution continues: There is persecution of Christians. There are still those, and there are many of them, who suffer and die to bear witness to Jesus, just as there are those who are penalized at various levels for the fact of acting in a way consistent with the Gospel, and those who strive every day to be faithful, without ado, to their good duties, while the world jeers and preaches otherwise.

ORDINARY TIME - During Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the fullness of the mystery of

Christ. The significance of Sundays of Ordinary Time is that they provide an opportunity to know Christ more intimately in the everyday realities of life. It is a time during which we can grow closer to the Lord and deepen our spiritual lives. Green is the standard color for Ordinary Time. Green symbolizes the hope and life of each new day. Ordinary Time is, for Catholics, the opportunity to allow the Lord to stir up our faith, to allow our spirits to rise and to grow in our spiritual life. The color green brings this meaning to the fore, since it is a color that evokes life and growth.

PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY JAN 18-25 - For this year, 2025, the prayers and reflections for Prayer for Christian Unity were prepared by the brothers and sisters of the monastic community of Bose in northern Italy. This year marks the 1,700th anniversary of the first Christian Ecumenical Council, held in Nicaea, in 325 AD. This commemoration provides a unique opportunity to reflect on and celebrate the common faith of Christians, as expressed in the Creed formulated during this Council; a faith that remains alive and fruitful in our days. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2025 offers an invitation to draw on this shared heritage and to enter more deeply into the faith that unites all Christians. This universal week of prayer encourages Christians of all denominations to meet, to pray together that all may be one, as Christ desires.

THE PERPETUITY OF THE CHURCH - Christ said to Peter: "Upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of Hell shall not prevail against it" (Mat 16:18). By the "gates \_\_\_\_\_

of Hell", He meant all the power of the devil - all kinds of attacks, physical violence as well as false teaching. Christ promises here that the Church would be assailed always, but never overcome. This promise of Our Lord has been proved for more than 2000 years by the facts of history. Not one of the persecutors of the Church has prevailed over it. On the contrary, many of them have come to a fearful end. There will always be Popes, bishops, and laity, to compose the Church; the truths taught by Our Lord



will always be found in His Church. The Apostles themselves understood Christ to mean that His Church should endure. They appointed successors in their place, instructed these successors to ordain in turn other bishops and priests, to live after them and carry on the Church. All these acts were to assure the perpetuity of the Church. (*to be continued*)
