

FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY & JOSEPH — The Gospel today starts with



his parents. Then came an event of Jesus' violent death – his mother watched with helplessness and unimaginable sorrow under the cross. When we speak of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, we speak of a family that struggled and suffered, like so many of the families nowadays. They shared our burdens. But this family knew profound hope. They trusted completely in God. They endured through the grace of God. They have one common goal, to help fulfill the will of God through their family. May all Christian families find inspiration from the holy family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

MARY, THE MOTHER OF GOD -(January 1) - On the very first day of every new year, January 1st, the Church appropriately honors the Blessed Virgin Mary with a Marian

feast day and a Holy Day of Obligation. And the title by which she is honored on this day is also the first Marian dogma defined by the Church: Mary, the Mother of God. Today we celebrate the Motherhood of Mary as the vessel through whom the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, Jesus Christ, took on a human nature. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, "Mary is truly 'Mother of God' since she is the mother of the eternal Son of
